

HISTORICAL CORNER

THE RECOVERY OF THE CREMATED REMAINS OF SUPERINTENDENT JOE ATHERTON RCMP



Joe Atherton retired from the RCMP in 1967 in E Division where he spent most of his service. He passed away in December 1988. In all that has been written about him and his

service and those who knew him are clear he was as dedicated as anyone could be to the RCMP. Before his passing Joe had asked that his cremated remains be buried on hallowed ground i.e. RCMP property. Following his cremation some of his close friends and colleagues with family approval carried out

Hoes last wish. I spot was identified beneath the flagpole at Heather Barracks on the HQ Site 4949 Heather St. Vancouver. With the future of this site uncertain it not being under the control of the RCMP anymore, researchers decided to find out all about the original "interment", its actual location and to have Joes remains removed and placed in a permanent RCMP location. Vancouver Divisions Donna Morse and Ric Hall carried out the research and the exact spot was established. This past summer various RCMP members including forensic services carried out the dig and recovered the remains. It is anticipated that Joes cremated remains will be interred with a fresh Urn at the RCMP Cemetery at Depot Division.

HONOURS and AWARDS

CORONATION MEDAL PRESENTATIONS.

It is customary in Britain, Canada and the Commonwealth that when a new sovereign is crowned commemorative medals are struck with the new and old monarchs head. Thus in 2023 when Charles Mountbatten-Windsor, The Prince of Wales ascended to the throne on the death of his mother Queen Elizabeth the 2nd medals were struck in Britain and other countries where the British Monarch is the

titular head of state. In Canada 30,000 of these medals were struck and distributed by the Chancellery of Honours at Rideau Hall to Federal Agencies and the Provinces and



Territories. (The CAF were allocated 4000 the RCMP not as many. Ed. Note I was unable to ascertain how many exactly) This included allocations to various veterans' organisations and charities including the RCMP Veterans. Vancouver Division nominations from our membership of 350 plus resulted in the five individuals mentioned here being decorated. Criteria for qualification differed from Great Britain in that the persons awarded have made a

significant contribution to Canada or to a particular province, territory, region or community of Canada, and be alive on 6 May 2023(!); in other words, they have to earn it! Vancouver Division members awarded the medals were;

Murray Macham²,

Dorothy Martinson and Jane Hill.

All are dedicated and hardworking individuals who have given freely of their time and efforts over a very long period to the Vancouver Division.


